



RING SIZING GUIDE

TIPS ON USING THIS GUIDE

- ◆ Prior to measuring your finger, confirm the accuracy of the printer paper by measuring the size of the box to your right with a ruler or measuring tape.
- ◆ Pull the paper sizer so that it is close-fitting to your finger. This will help yield an accurate measurement.
- ◆ Measure your finger at the end of the day to get a more accurate measurement.
- ◆ Do not measure your finger when your hands are cold or wet.
- ◆ Bands and rings that are larger than 5mm in width may fit more tightly than rings of the same size in a narrower width.

ACCURACY TEST

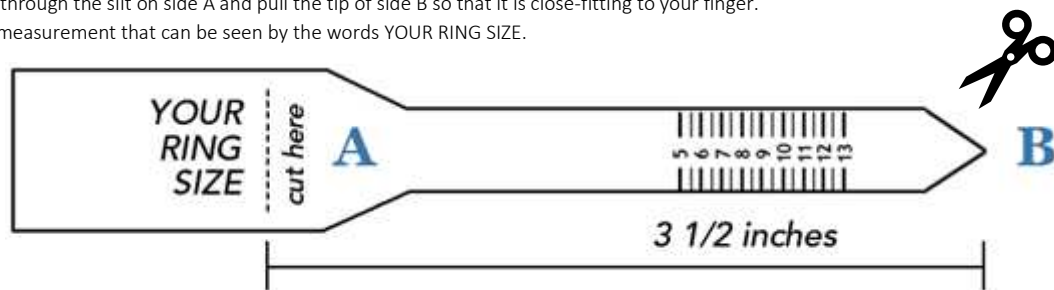


Measure with ruler to make sure paper printed accurately. Confirm that the length is **two inches** long before using ring sizing guides.

THERE ARE TWO EASY WAYS TO MEASURE YOUR RING SIZE.

OPTION 1: Use cut out ring sizer.

- ◆ Using scissors, cut out the ring sizer.
- ◆ Cut a slit in the paper on side A as indicated by the dotted line (*cut here*).
- ◆ Loop side B through the slit on side A and pull the tip of side B so that it is close-fitting to your finger.
- ◆ Record the measurement that can be seen by the words YOUR RING SIZE.



OPTION 2: Use an existing ring and compare it on our chart.

- ◆ Choose an existing ring that fits properly on the finger you are buying a ring for.
- ◆ Place the ring flat on the paper and compare to the different sizes until you find the image that matches the *inside measurement* of your ring.
- ◆ If the ring falls in between two sizes, order the quarter size in the middle.
